Transportation Updates

Gary Dixon has applied for a \$15,000 grant for playground equipment. He is looking for assistance raising an additional \$9,000 in effort to obtain playground equipment for Curtisville Primary Center through Kaboom Imaginatory. Collaborative fundraising efforts on this project will be further investigated with LPEP and the transportation department at Deerlakes. Bus schedules planning is underway. Routes are designed based on going farthest then heading back to maximum fuel as well as taking safety concerns into account. Turnarounds are avoided as well as situations where buses can bottom out or need to make left turns.

East Union is Partnering with The Leukemia and Lymphoma Society (LLS) for a three week fundraising drive to raise money for research. April 30th-May 17th. This fundraising effort is close to all our hearts with Mighty Marco currently fighting this battle. Assembly introduced the program on Monday and the drive began. Students received their coin collection boxes and each homeroom classroom received a larger box. Weekly classroom boxes will be emptied and some friendly competition has begun. Incentives are provided by LLS and building staff. Incentives include an Olive Garden Lunch for class with the highest collection total and free afternoon of recess and movie for grade level with the highest collection. During each of the three weeks extra incentives will be added to up the fun. Week 1 - Give a Dollar, Wear a hat, Be a hero. Week 2 – Special pencil sale. Week 3 – That’s a wrap.
